Hello Room 213 Families,

Happy April and Happy Autism Acceptance Month! I hope everyone enjoyed some extra family time over the break, and I look forward to seeing all of my students tomorrow. This month, our unit theme from Unique is called "Changing our Land."

In ELA, we continue to work on rhyming words and recognizing spelling patterns, especially in CVC and CCVC words. Some students are working on digraphs, while others are working on single letter sound or letter recognition. Students work on reading comprehension skills in daily small groups. Students will also practice tracing or writing their names daily (first name for some students, last name for students who have mastered first name), as well as working on their specific IEP reading and writing goals.

In math, students will continue to participate in calendar math time each morning. During group math time, we will continue practicing counting to 100 by 1's, as well as skip counting by 5's, 10's, and 100's. We are also learning about place value each day. During work time, students will work on their IEP specific goals related to number recognition, counting, math functions, 1:1 correspondence, representing double digit numbers with 10's and 1's, and sorting shapes.

During our Science and Social Studies block, we will continue to complete the interactive "Class News" or "Daily Weather" functions of our curriculum. We will also focus on learning about the construction, geography, and how things are made.
